Gold winners will advance to compete in the Asia ESG Positive Impact Regional Awards 2026 in Malaysia.




# ABOUT THE AWARDS



# ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

## COMPANY ENTRY CRITERIA

### DULY INCORPORATED

1. The company is duly incorporated in the Philippines with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and registered with the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR).

### BUSINESS PERMITS

2. The company has the associated local business permits (Barangay Clearance, Mayor's Permit, etc).

### AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS


3. The company must submit audited financial statements and income tax returns (ITRs) for the past three (3) consecutive financial years.

### NO LEGAL OR FINANCIAL RISKS

4. The company must not be bankrupt and must not have any legal suits or negative reputational factors that may impair the image of this award program. This may be subject to additional verification by the organizers.

### PROJECT DOCUMENTATION

5. The company must be able to provide relevant documentation to support the projects/initiatives it is submitting for evaluation (ex. concept notes/planning documents, implementation reports, monitoring and evaluation reports, survey data, stakeholders feedback, media clippings or press releases, etc).



# ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

## PROJECT ENTRY CRITERIA

### ELIGIBILITY PERIOD

1. Entries can be for projects that started or were completed from January to December 2024. However, the project will only be judged based on impact made in the 2025 calendar year.

### RELEVANCE TO CATEGORY

2. The company must be able to prove that the specified initiative is in line with the category for which it is being submitted, through pertinent documentation (ex. Concept notes/planning documents, beneficiaries or stakeholders analysis, SDG research to prove alignment to goal and/or corresponding indicators, etc).

### MULTI-CATEGORY SUBMISSIONS

3. One project may be submitted for multiple categories. The approval of the same is subject to the discretion of the organizers.

### PROVEN IMPACT

4. Impact and outcomes must be provable through both qualitative and quantitative data, as appropriate. The company must be able to provide data on such outcomes to support their submission for the awards.

### VERIFICATION OF INFORMATION

5. The information provided on this may be subject to additional verification by the organizers.

# JUDGING OF ENTRIES

All applications for the Awards will be evaluated by independent judges based on prescribed criteria.

Judges are selected from our working partners and are from highly reputable foundations and organisations who have undeniable expertise in their own fields within the ESG scope. The judges are grouped into several panels to ensure there is an avenue for cross-checking and sharing of views to moderate discussions to ensure the most equitable outcome.

The judges will award scores for each applicant's responses to the criteria/guidelines as set out in this submission pack. These criteria will be weighted based on their relevance and importance. The scores will then be tabulated by the auditor of the Awards and the applicant with the highest scores in a particular award will be the winner.

Presentation to the judges is not required at the initial stage when companies send in submissions for their awards. However, after the judging process, finalists who have been selected from each category will be asked to present their ESG stories. There won't be any site visits by the judges as well. Evaluations are based on the guidelines submitted. Applicants are strongly encouraged to address all areas to show why they deserve to win in the respective categories.

4. The Organiser will vet, verify and may undertake further background checks on the submissions received to determine their authenticity.
5. Shortlisted companies may be contacted for media interviews, materials collection, and marketing promotions and activities at no additional cost to the Organiser.
6. By responding to the Organiser's request for additional information during the background-checking process, the shortlisted companies hereby warrant that all information submitted herein to the Organiser is true, accurate, current, and complete.
7. Shortlisted submissions will undergo a few rounds of judging by panels of judges using information obtained from the background checks and submission process.

If a participant fails to respond after three (3) attempts, the Organizer shall have the right to disregard their submission and disqualify the company from contention for the relevant categories

## Winners


